On behalf of those we serve, who are in need of food and health care, we want to say thank you to each person who has helped in providing these services.


This report provides an overview of programs and services delivered in the past year. It also shows a comparison for the last three years.

#### HEALTH CARE SERVICES PROVIDED

The Shifa Clinic serves adults (18-64) who do not qualify for county health care, do not have private insurance, Medicare, Medicaid, and who cannot self-pay. Through our volunteer physicians we are able to provide GYN (no OB) and primary care services.



### **COLLABORATORS**

#### TRICOUNTY RADIOLOGY ASSOCIATES

Shifa clinic has collaborated with Tricounty Radiology to provide eligible patients with no cost imaging services.

With the help of MUSC we are able to provide our patients with no cost screening mammograms, reduced cost diagnostic mammograms and surgery referrals.



LabCorp provides leading-edge medical laboratory tests and services through a national network of primary clinical laboratories and specialized Centers of Excellence. They provide all our lab services at no cost to all Shifa Clinic patients.



### **COLLABORATORS**



The Access Health Tri-County Network (AHTN) is comprised of 27 partners providing a wide range of healthcare and health-related services to uninsured residents in Berkeley, Charleston, and Dorchester counties with a coordinated approach to access to healthcare. Their network partners consist of hospitals, free clinics, healthcare centers, outreach providers, department of mental health, local health department and volunteer primary care/specialty care providers.



Through Merck's patient assistance program we are able to provide eligible patients with the Gardasil vaccine.



The South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) is the state agency charged with protecting public health, coastal resources, and the state's land, air and water quality as authorized under multiple state and federal laws.

**DHEC** has provided the Shifa Clinic with vaccines free of charge to help the community. These vaccines include Tetanus, Flu, and Twinrix.



### **OUTREACH PROGRAMS**



With the generous help of local businesses and individual donors the Shifa Clinic raised funds through a silent auctions, bake sales, garage sales and our event "Coming Together for the Common Good".

Through generous donations from local businesses, gift cards were provided for silent auctions. In addition, garage sale items were donated from the community as well as from individuals. There were 300 free book bags filled with pencils, crayons, rulers, notebooks, erasers, sharpeners, highlighters, pens given away on King Street downtown Charleston on Saturday August 10th, 2013 and at The First African Evangelical Christian Church Daycare. Overall results showed a 20% increase from the previous year thanks to the effort of the community and individual volunteers.










### FUND RAISING EVENT 2014

#### **Coming Together for the Common Good**

Representatives of multiple faiths came together to support our Back 2 School Program for needy children. Begun in 2012 the Shifa Clinic's has been providing backpacks filled with school supplies for children on the peninsula.

The event was cosponsored by the Catholic Student Association and the Jewish Student Union/Hillel and was held at the College of Charleston Jewish Student Union/Hillel. Longtime women's right advocate Jennet Robinson Alterman was our keynote speaker along with Ms. Marsha Alterman (College of Charleston Jewish Life advisor), Jim Grove, (Chairman of the Religions Life Council at the College of Charleston), and Dr. Reshma Khan (College Student advisor for Muslim Student Association).









### **OUTREACH PROGRAMS**

Since the clinic opened in 2012 not only has medical care been provided to those in need, but through various programs we have addressed hunger prevention as well. Our current hunger prevention programs are Feed the Homeless and Child Hunger Prevention Program.

**Feed the Homeless:** With the generous help of Saffron Café, who provides and prepares all the food we serve, and the help of many volunteers, we are able to provide a hot meal for 120 homeless people every month.





**Child Hunger Prevention Program:** This is our newest program and we have been able to expand quickly with the help of many individual donors. Each week we are currently providing food bags for twenty local elementary school children. We have partnered with Eagles Nest Elementary school who has identified children who are in need of assistance and every two weeks we deliver forty food bags, which provide twenty children with 6 meals, and 4 snacks for the weekend. In 2014 we provided 170 food bags for a total of 1,020 meals.







## FUND RAISING EVENT 2014

#### **Serving Humanity Together**

To generate funds for our outreach programs the focus of our event in 2014 was Serving Humanity Together. This was held at our clinic and we were joined by Walgreens, who provided no cost flu shots, Fauzia's Food Truck, many local businesses, who provided gift cards for our silent auction, and many volunteers who gave baked goods for our bake sale. The event was a fun filled evening and all the proceeds generated went to our Feed the Homeless and Child Hunger Prevention Programs.
