You believed in our mission to provide health care to the under served in Tri-county area when it first started operations on January 7th 2012 on a very small scale with humble beginnings of 4 hours a week of service. With your support we are now a full time clinic operating Monday through Friday 9-4 pm. Your gracious contribution of time, funds and compassion continue to allow us to provide excellent patient care week after week, and literally has changed the lives of our neighbors in need all year. This year we complete 5 years of service. All praise to God Almighty.

In a short time, we have built a foundation to support a solid volunteer team, dedicated staff, have connected with community resources to continue delivering primary care, advanced Gynecological care, Vision services, Mental health Services, Lab diagnostic testing, and medications to people who do not have health insurance. In addition expanded outreach services with Food pantry on site.

Shifa clinic welcomes individuals and families who lack health insurance and whose income is at or above 250% of the federal poverty level. Clinic clients receive the medical attention, medication, practical information and monthly grocery supplies they need to maintain their health in a friendly and caring atmosphere. The Clinic also serves as a valuable resource in helping to locate follow-up services.

The Clinic is and will remain a key resource for those in need in our community and we rely on our loyal and compassionate staff, volunteers and generous donors to help us meet our mission. We have partnered with this community to change the lives of our neighbors in need and we look forward to partnering with you again in the future to continue this great legacy. 




Diabetes Prevention Program through CDC recognized curriculum

This September 2016 marked our start up of CDC recognized curriculum for DPP. The program is an evidence-based program shown to reduce the burden of type 2 diabetes – one of the nation's costliest chronic diseases.

This small-group program helps people with prediabetes eat healthier, increase their physical activity, and lose weight, which can delay or even prevent the onset of type 2 diabetes.

Diabetes Prevention Program is a year long program with 16 weekly sessions followed by 8 monthly sessions.

In a relaxed classroom setting, a trained Lifestyle Coach helps participants learn skills to help them incorporate healthy eating, increase physical activity, and make other behavior changes a part of their everyday lives. The goals of the program are 7 percent weight loss and an increase in physical activity to 150 minutes per week.





Educational Programs for Community

Cervical Cancer Awareness

Through the mini grant given by Cervical cancer free SC multiple session of cervical cancer awareness programs were conducted across Hispanic churches and locally at the clinic.

These group sessions had participants recruited via social media, church flyers as well as personal invitations. Each group session was led by a clinical staff team, local volunteer team, translators and physician providers.

Pretest was conducted to check the baseline information of the participants followed by a video regarding information on Cervical cancer and HPV vaccine. Post test was conducted.

Each session offered participants to ask questions, learn the importance of prevention of cervical cancer. Incentives as \$10 gas cards, registration for free health care at clinic. T shirts were given out.

We have conducted 6 sessions so far . Three of those were in following churches : a) Divine Reedeemer b) Iglesia Bautista C) Volviendoapentecostes

Three of the others were done at the clinic.




Public Health Interns


When our neighboring suite was available for renting we took this opportunity to expand into our neighboring suite. Once the process was complete we scheduled Open house which was well attended and was a success.

This Event was part sponsored by Roper Saint francis. We are very grateful for this sponsorship.


Our goals of the event were to raise awareness about the clinic, spread peace among all faiths and provide a portal to come together under one common good, and raise funds for the clinic and its programs.

We add a fun event to the giveaways as a small carnival for kids with snacks.











