


VALUES

HEALTH CARE SERVICES PROVIDED

The Shifa Clinic serves adults (18-64) who do not qualify for county health care, do not have private insurance, Medicare, Medicaid, and who cannot self-pay. It is strictly a GYN service and no OB services or prenatal care are available.






SHIFA STATISTICS AT A GLANCE






OUR MOVING FORCE

The South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) is the state agency charged with protecting public health, coastal resources, and the state's land, air and water quality as authorized under multiple state and federal laws.

DHEC has provided the Shifa Clinic with vaccines free of charge to help the community. These vaccines include Tetanus, Flu, and Twinrix.

Through Merck we have patient assistance programs which help in providing other vaccines including Gardasil, Pnuemovax, MMR and Recombivax.

The SCFCA was incorporated as an independent 501(c)(3) non-profit organization in January 2008.



The Access Health Tri-County Network (AHTN) is comprised of 27 partners providing a wide range of healthcare and health-related services to uninsured residents in Berkeley, Charleston, and Dorchester counties with a coordinated approach to access to healthcare. 



