



HEALTH CARE SERVICES PROVIDED

The Shifa Clinic serves adults (18-64) who do not qualify for county health care, do not have private insurance, Medicare, Medicaid, and who cannot self-pay. It is strictly a GYN service and no OB services or prenatal care are available.





LabCorp provides leading-edge medical laboratory tests and services through a national network of primary clinical laboratories and specialized Centers of Excellence. They provide lab services free of charge to the clinic.

The mission of Miller-Motte is to help students acquire the essential career and personal skills and knowledge necessary to secure initial employment in their chosen field

The Shifa Clinic has signed an agreement with MMTC for providing externship hours to the students. The students also help with donations of non-medical supplies for the need of the patients such as clothes, shoes, and bags.

The South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) is the state agency charged with protecting public health, coastal resources, and the state's land, air and water quality as authorized under multiple state and federal laws.

DHEC has provided the Shifa Clinic with vaccines free of charge to help the community. These vaccines include Tetanus, Flu, and Twinrix.






COLLABORATIONS



Through Merck we have patient assistance programs running which helps in providing other vaccines including Gardasil, Pnuemovax, MMR and Recombivax.



Clinic refers the patients to Hollings Cancer Center mobile health unit for screening mammograms and the center in turn refer unfunded patients to the clinic if they do not have a primary care providers. We work together as community partners to address the needs of the uninsured, underserved in the communities we serve. In addition, Hollings Cancer Center breast health patient navigation program provides help to the patients referred to the Center by working to remove any barriers (financial, transportation, language, social etc.) to them receiving timely screening, diagnostic and treatment services.



CLINIC MEMBERSHIP



SCFCA is an independent, nonprofit membership organization that provides training and technical assistance, research, resource development and advocacy to Free Clinics throughout South Carolina. SCFCA represents and supports our states network of 40 Free Clinics, which provides comprehensive health care to the uninsured. The SCFCA was incorporated as an independent 501(c)(3) non-profit organization in January 2008.



The Access Health Tri-County Network (AHTN) is comprised of 27 partners providing a wide range of healthcare and health-related services to uninsured residents in Berkeley, Charleston, and Dorchester counties with a coordinated approach to access to healthcare. Their network partners consist of hospitals, free clinics, healthcare centers, outreach providers, department of mental health, local health department and volunteer primary care/specialty care providers.



CLINIC MEMBERSHIP



The National Association of Free and Charitable Clinics (NAFC) is the only nonprofit 501c(3) organization whose mission is solely focused on the issues and needs of the more than 1,200 Free and Charitable Clinics and the people they serve in the United States. TASHA GILLIARD




Tasha is 43-years-old and was diagnosed with breast cancer. Now after surgery and treatment, she is happy, satisfied and on her way to a healthy life.
