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




# Our Impact

#### Patient Visits over the past three years:


- Shifa has had over 5,000 patient visits over the past 5 years.

- Since 2015, Shifa Clinic has seen a 231% growth in recipients from its hunger prevention program.



# Educational Programs

The Student Rotation Program at Shifa Clinic provides students with educational and clinical training in numerous areas of medicine. The program was developed to provide excellent educational orientation in clinical environments as a means to develop general knowledge in areas of patient diagnosis and management. Students receive basic medical knowledge in diverse clinical areas. Shifa clinic is an accredited site for rotations established by:

- 1. Trident/ MUSC family practice residency program for Family Practice 2nd Residents
- 2. MUSC nursing students, Nurse practioner students, and Physician assistant students,
- 3. College of Charleston public health interns
- 4. Miller mote technical college medical assistant students
- 5. Various online Nurse Practioner programs for NP students.



#### Shifa clinic received accreditation from AADE for DSME program.

The DSME is a group clinic to learn how to take charge of your diabetes. The program consists of four sessions over the course of 3 months for total of 6 hours. Each week focuses on a specific topic. Sessions are facilitated from a highly detailed manual from DHEC by two trained instructors. Classes are highly participative, where mutual support and success build the participants' confidence in their ability to manage their health and maintain active and fulfilling lives. Each participant in the workshop receives a copy of the companion book and session notes.









The National Diabetes Prevention Program (DPP) is an evidence-based lifestyle change program which has been demonstrated to delay or prevent the development of type 2 diabetes among people at high risk. The program consists of trained lifestyle coach who facilitates a small group of adults to discuss behavior changes that can improve the health of participants. The program consists of 25 one-hour sessions delivered over the course of a year.

- Lose 5-7% of your body weight
- Gradually increase your physical activity to 150 minutes per week.

# Speciality Clinics

#### Services Provided:

1. A comprehensive eye exam includes a number of tests and procedures to examine and evaluate the health of your eyes and the quality of your vision. These tests range from simple ones, like having you read an eye chart, to complex tests, such as using a high-powered lens to examine the health of the tissues inside of your eyes.

Should a vision provider determine that a patient needs prescription glasses, we will refer them to a partner program to receive free glasses. If a vision provider suspects a patient has an eye disease such as cataracts or severe retinopathy, we will try to refer them to receive free or low cost

specialty care.







#### Pediatric Clinic

Shifa Clinic has launched a new, free pediatric clinic for children and youth to be held twice a month. The pediatric clinic offers children, youth, and their families a wide variety of services, including immunizations, well-child check-ups, sick-child check-ups, sports physicals and other services.



The Shifa Prenatal Clinic entered into a partnership with MUSC Trident Family practice Residency program .Our goal is for patients to see the same doctor at every visit. The Residents under guidance will see and follow the patient till ready for delivery and then care will be transferred over to MUSC/Trident Family practice program.

Any high risk pregnancies will be transferred to low cost Northwoods clinic.
