

Stephanie Smith-Phillips, M.D.



Story of Medina Edilia

Medina Edilia is a 74 year old female who presented at the clinic for check up on a painless waxy, perl lesion on the right tip of her nose. The lesion had been present for the last two years with sustained growth. Upon examination and proper investigation, through a dermatopathology biopsy report, the lesion was found to be an Invasive Basal Cell Carcinoma. Medina underwent a procedure called a MOHS surgery with reconstruction that was completed at Mt. Pleasant Dermatology at no cost. Story of Walter Morán

Walter is 28 years old and origin from Guatemala who presented at Shifa Clinic for an enlarging scalp mass. He had sought attention at other clinics where he was treated with antibiotics; incision and drainage and no definitive care. We referred him to Dr Hochmann who very generously accepted the referral at no cost to the patient. On referral, Walter had a 250 cm2 multi-lobulated mass involving the left forehead and scalp. Surgical excision was carried out under anesthesia at no charge at The Facial Surgery Center. The patient's postoperative course was unremarkable except in the diagnosis of a low-grade malignant tumor that required radiation therapy. This radiation therapy was performed under Roper Hospital.





"I believed that my case was impossible and thanked God and all the doctors who helped me. When I came to Shifa from Maryland, I felt very comfortable, especially with the treatment they gave me, they treated me very well. Before, I was desperate because I had gone to many places. Nobody wanted to help me, and I even said how much money had to pay for this and nobody, nobody, nobody helped me. I feel very grateful to the Clinic and Dr. Hochmann, and I would like to motivate many doctors who can help in these cases like mine, which is not shared and so in many instances in which the Hispanic family needs a lot of help. On behalf of everyone and some who cannot speak, I am happy with everything that has happened."

Carlos Castro's Story

Carlos came with his mother from Mexico when he was 17 years old. At 20 years old, he was diagnosed with diabetes Type I. After an accident in Colorado, he started to feel sick and decided to see a doctor, and when he visited the hospital, they found that his blood sugar was 1,100. The doctor was impressed and said he could handle it only because he was young. Later, he visited the MUSC, and they referred him to the Shifa Clinic. Carlos has been a Shifa Patient since 2016.

"I have been to many clinics, however, the Shifa Clinic has treated me very well and has given me the medications I need. They are very good people, which is why I continue in the clinic. Being diabetic has affected my everyday life; It has changed my life because if I did not have the support of Shifa, I would not know what to do, especially with insulin. For them all my thanks and respect."

VACCINE CLINICS

Vaccine clinics were established to provide access to COVID vaccines. This was done both on site as well as off site in different places including parking lots, community centers and other organizations.

ICNA RELIEF received grant funding from HRSA and NAFC to increase COVID-19 vaccine access in the underserved and immigrant population across 11 states in US. Through the mercy of God Almighty, dedicated leadership, staff and volunteers, we were able to work tirelessly in creating innovative strategies for strengthening our campaign. Our strategies to provide outreach education included in-person interactions in multiple languages, scheduling multiple health fairs and vaccine events, social media and flyer distributions.

We kept transparent, accurate financial records, developed collaborations with other local non-profits, health departments and vaccine supply chains to bridge the gap in various underserved immigrant and Muslim populations.

We continue to strive and do our part in ending the pandemic in 2022.







PEDIATRIC OUTREACH

Thanks to our volunteer pediatric providers, we are able to provide successful outreach clinics. These clinics were held at Pinehurst Elementary School, migrant camps and at the Shifa Clinic. Our goal is to partner with schools and organizations that serve low income families, in order to provide outreach clinical care and vaccinations to families and children. We want to keep children healthy and limit the number of absentee days from school.



CLINIC HIGHLIGHTS





We have maintained and received our 2021 accreditation from South Carolina Free Clinic Association. Being a Best Chance Network Provider has helped us provide no cost mammograms to help screen women for breast cancer



Our organization earned a 2021 Gold Rating from the National Association of Free & Charitable Clinics (NAFC) Quality Standards Program. We earned this rating by attesting that we have certain policies and procedures in place to provide quality care for our patients.



Due to the help for the expansion of the Choose Well grant, we now are able to dispense from our pharmacy long-acting contraceptive devices, injections, patches and Nuva Ring - at no cost to the patient. This allows us to continue to help the families of the community.



We are very excited to be chosen as one of the two first official members of the Help Me Grow partner network in the state of SC.

Help Me Grow SC launched a state office at South Carolina Infant Mental Health Association (SCIMHA) in 2020 with the intention of establishing a statewide network that will build capacity among communities to provide access to services for young children and their families. The network partner grants are designed to assist recipients in establishing, enhancing and maintaining a network of community partners providing child development services and resources to local families and community members.





BCN CANCER SCREEN Quality Improvement Program


BCN Cancer Screen Initiative program was hosted by SC DHEC's Division of Cancer Control and Prevention, in partnership with Leader's Imago, LLC. Our clinic was chosen as one of the 4 cohort clinics in SC to participate in the program and funded with \$10,000 to provide patient navigation screening services.


The primary aim is to increase utilization of evidence-based interventions to maximize breast cancer screening

OUTCOMES

Provide educational campaigns and resources to improve vaccinations across lifespan DHEC approved us as a Provider for COVID-19 vaccinations. Funds from HRSA and NAFC were used for outreach and campaigns regarding COVID Vaccinations. We reached 43,207 via campaigns and vaccinated 1,384 individuals.

Provide outreach and medical services to children who are uninsured and immigrants

Secured 2 new volunteer pediatric providers to help in outreach. Collaborated and signed MOU with Pinehurst Elementary school to provide off-site pediatric clinics for uninsured children.

Continue to strengthen our vision program

Secured a stable volunteer optometrist for consistent vision clinics twice a month. Collaborated with a local ophthalmologist who also agreed to provide free care at her office to Shifa patients.

Sustain hunger prevention program and promote prosperity by working to ensure that all people in our community have consistent, dependable access to food

Along with onsite food pantry and giveaways we collaborated with Amazon to provide food deliveries to 220 families a month.




